

From The Pastor's Desk..

Two events last month got me to thinking about the future of St. Paul's UMC. The first was the release of the first images from the James Webb Space Telescope, allowing us to see deeper into the cosmos than ever before. The images have been stunning, and the possibilities of further staggering discoveries boggles the mind.

The other event was the heat wave that seemed to have much of the northern hemisphere in its grip for weeks on end. Wildfires, deaths, and shattered heat records (England recorded its highest temperature in history) have contributed to a realization that the time to act to address the perils of climate change is rapidly dwindling.

Here at St. Paul's we are trying to do our part and recycling where possible, using Zoom for meetings (thus reducing our carbon footprint), not using chemicals on the weeds, and watering less often. But is this enough?

Consider this from The United Methodist Church's 2016 Book of Resolutions, The Natural World: Global Climate Stewardship:

“We acknowledge the global impact of humanity's disregard for God's creation. Rampant industrialization and the corresponding increase in the use of fossil fuels have led to a buildup of pollutants in the earth's atmosphere. These 'greenhouse gas' emissions threaten to alter dramatically the earth's climate for generations to come with severe environmental, economic, and social implications. The adverse impacts of global climate change disproportionately affect individuals and nations least responsible for the emissions. We therefore support efforts of all governments to require mandatory reductions in greenhouse gas emissions and call on individuals, congregations, businesses, industries, and communities to reduce their emissions.”

I believe that as people of faith, we have an obligation to respond to this crisis with one eye on the scriptures, where in Genesis 1:28 we read, “God blessed them, and God said to them, ‘Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth.’” This dominion is intended to convey a responsibility for creation, not an exploitation of it.

It does us no good to peer into the depths of the cosmos if we can't be bothered to look into our own hearts. We have no business exploring distant worlds if we can't be trusted to care for the one we're on.

I would ask each person reading this to do two things: first, to consider what you are doing in your own home to be a good steward of what God has placed in your hands. And secondly, to use your voice to speak to your friends, family, neighbors, politicians, businesses, etc. to say there is still time to act and the time to act is now.
