

## *From The Pastor's Desk..*

In December 1969, Charlie Brown, despairing over the lack of meaning and purpose in the holiday celebrations taking place around him, cried out, "Isn't there anyone who knows what Christmas is all about?" Linus, standing near, said, "Sure, Charlie Brown, I can tell you what Christmas is all about," and he then proceeds to recite from the gospel according to Luke 2:8-10:

And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger. And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men.

When I went to listen to the speech on YouTube, I came upon the following explanation of this famous scene: "Did you ever notice that Linus drops his security blanket while sharing 'what Christmas is all about'? Just as he utters the words 'Fear not' from Luke 2:10, 'And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people.' I believe this was a deliberate point that Charles Schultz was making, to drop those things of the world we cling to and embrace the good news!"

In the time leading up to Christmas Day, I invite you to consider dropping those things which are coming between you and the good news of Jesus's birth, be they people, things, or activities. If the good news means anything to you, will you join me in considering how the birth of a child in ancient Bethlehem could have an impact on your life? Or as John Wesley said, "For with the Redeemer's birth, peace and all kinds of happiness come down to dwell on earth: yea, the overflowings of divine good-will and favour are now exercised toward men." (Explanatory Notes Upon the New Testament, *Luke 2:14.*)

This is what Christmas is all about.
