

# The Epistle of St. Paul's--February 2020

## From the Pastor's Desk

Ah February, what are we to make of you? The novelty of winter has long since worn off and spring is an agonizingly long way off. Still in the grip of winter, we are able to look forward this month to Groundhog Day, Valentine's Day and Presidents Day. On the church calendar, this month is significant due to the arrival of Lent on Ash Wednesday, February 26. According to the dictionary, the word *February* comes from the Latin word *Februa*, which means purification, via the purification ritual *Februa* held on February 15 in the Roman lunar calendar.

I've been doing a lot of thinking about Lent and what it means to me on practical and personal (secular) levels, and church (spiritual) level. We all know about the custom of spring cleaning, or as Belinda and I call it, "clearing the decks." On a practical level, cleaning prevents disease and provides for an appealing aesthetic. On a personal level it provides care, context, and space for the things we value and for seeing just what we actually have and/or need!

On a spiritual level, cleaning serves much the same purpose and provides the same benefits as we have with the practical and personal cleaning. Spiritual cleaning allows disease (sin) to be removed from our life, revealing the beautiful soul God created us to be. Spiritual cleaning provides the opportunity to remove from our life those attitudes, behaviors, and other clutter and to see the spiritual life for what it is: the opportunity to really live in the Light of God's Love.

Christianity is a communal faith; it cannot be done alone. Our faith, which is a gift from God, is meant to be shared. The great thing about Lent is that unlike the cleaning that takes place in our homes where we are doing all the work, Lent is done with the support of our brothers and sisters in the Lord. On Ash Wednesday you'll once more be given the opportunity to purposefully engage in the Christian discipline of Lent, aka, Spiritual Cleaning. By coming to worship on the 26th, you'll show others

that you are supporting them in their Christian walks, and that you are in turn trusting in their support of your walk. “I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to observe a holy Lent: by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God’s Holy Word.” —*The United Methodist Book of Worship*, p. 322

### **Ash Wednesday at St. Paul’s**

On February 26th at 7:00 p.m. we’ll mark the beginning of the season of Lent with an Ash Wednesday service. What makes Lent different from much of rest of the church year is that Hallmark has yet to figure out how to market repentance, reflection and restoration. In this worship service, we’ll be invited to commit ourselves to growing closer to the Lord.

### **Lenten Sermon Series**

Beginning on March 1<sup>st</sup>, Pastor Charles will be sharing a Lenten sermon series which takes a long view of Holy Week, beginning with the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. So often it happens that we arrive at Palm Sunday waving branches and then rush to

get to Easter morning, forgetting that some other stuff happened that week! Using the gospel according to Mark as the source, each week we'll look at the events of Holy Week with a reflective eye on the week that changed the world.

March 15: Conflict and More Conflict (Mark 11:20-13:37)

March 22: The Need for a Traitor (Mark 14:1-11)

March 29: A Last Supper and Gethsemane (Mark 14:12-71)

April 5: The Crucifixion of Jesus (Mark 15:1-41)

April 12: Easter Sunday: Resurrection (Mark 16:1-8)
