

From The Pastor's Desk...

STELL

I am no longer my own, but Thine. Put me to what Thou wilt, rank me with whom Thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed by Thee or laid aside for Thee, exalted for Thee or brought low for Thee. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and heartily yield all things to Thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, Thou art mine, and I am Thine. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen.

This prayer, taken from the Covenant Renewal Service, was adapted from the Puritan tradition by John Wesley and introduced to the Methodist Societies in 1775. Ever since then, the heirs of Wesley have offered themselves to God through this reminder that it is in God's name and service that we enter the year before us. It is in this spirit that I offer it for your consideration as we here at St. Paul's UMC enter into our 60th year as a faith community.

Read the words of the prayer. Then read them again. And again and again. Cut the prayer out of the newsletter and put it in your wallet or purse. Tape it to your bathroom mirror or next to the TV remote. Make it part of each and every day in 2024.

Wesley understood that it is easy to utter pious words in the safety and comfort of a worship service when surrounded by other like-minded souls. However, it is harder when making our way in the world, surrounded by voices telling us that there are other gods that we might enjoying serving through our words, actions, and desires.

It is my hope and prayer that, as we read this prayer, the dawn of the New Year might be made bright and clear in the light of Christ. It is my hope and prayer that as we make this prayer an integral part of our walk of faith, we will make our lives living witnesses to the life-affirming Spirit of God. It is my hope and prayer that as individuals affirming our being in the grace of Christ, we might turn to our friends, family, and neighbors and together create a community of faith that nurtures and supports our common ministry in the world around us.

Read the words of the prayer. Then read them again. And again and again. It's going to be an amazing year at St. Paul's UMC, and I am looking forward to experiencing God together with you in the coming months.

New! Free Community Yoga Class at St. Paul's

Beginning January 20, St. Paul's will offer a FREE community yoga class on Saturdays from 9:00 to 10:00 a.m. in Franz Hall. The class will be coordinated by Rebecca Glancy and taught by Jovanka Jones. Both are certified and insured yoga instructors. This class is open to all people 16 years of age or older and is intended to bring people from the neighborhood and wider community into the church. The program will be supported by funds remaining from the Heart of SOBO grant. The class is designed for moderately fit to active practitioners; we will offer modifications for beginners and challenges for advanced students. Participants will need to complete a liability waiver but do not need to register for the class or reserve a spot in advance. Students should wear comfortable clothing and bring water and a yoga mat.
