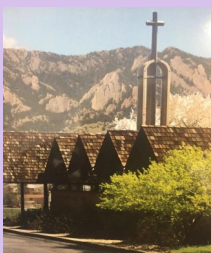

From The Pastor's Desk...

There are times in everyone's faith journey when we become aware that we are at a crossroads moment. These are the times when we have a decision or decisions to make, decisions that we will refer to years down the road as one of those moments when time is marked as before and afterwards. May 21 and 24, 1738, were two such crossroad moments for the people called Methodist.

On May 21, 1738, Pentecost Sunday, Charles Wesley found himself sick in bed. Following a visit from his brother John and some friends, he rested and prayed, rising in strength and power, immediately setting pen to paper, and composed two great hymns: "And Can It Be That I Should Gain" and "Where Shall My Wondering Soul Begin." This marked a turning point in his life and ministry after which this already prolific poet became one of the greatest hymn writers in the history of the Christian faith.

Three days later, his brother John experienced the assurance of salvation which he records in his journal: *"In the evening I went very unwillingly to a [Moravian] society in Aldersgate Street, where one was reading [Martin] Luther's preface to the Epistle to the Romans. About a quarter before nine, while he was describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone, for salvation; and an assurance was given me that He had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death."* This turned an Anglican clergyman, drifting without purpose in his life and work, into a dynamic force for the gospel that burned brightly across the British Isles for the next fifty-plus years and continues across the world to this very day.

I mention these two events as examples of what can happen when people of faith make themselves available to the presence of God at work in their life and in the world around them. Neither of these events happened without the presence of others in their lives. For Charles, it was the visitation of friends and family, sharing in his vulnerability, which gave him the assurance of God's presence in his weakness. For John, it was a Bible study, which awoke in him the realization that God's love was meant for everyone, including himself!

I believe that each of us at St. Paul's can have our own "Aldersgate" experiences this month. It could be in Tim's adult study on Sunday morning, it could be with the Wednesday morning Zoom visit, or it could be during a call or visit with someone who needs to know God's love is still available to them. Wherever you go and whom-ever you meet this month, you will come into contact with the power and presence of God.

St. Paul's needs people whose lives are being transformed by God. Will you join the chorus of creation in shouting to the cosmos what God has done in your life? St. Paul's is at a crossroad, and the future of this community of faith is in the balance. Which way will we go, and who will lead the way?
