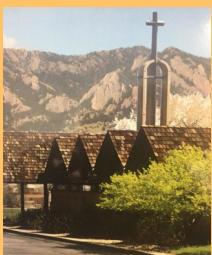

From The Pastor's Desk...

In November 2006, I was invited to preach at the American Thanksgiving service at St. Andrew's Church in Plymouth, Devon, UK (the church the Pilgrims worshipped in the night before they sailed). This service kicked off the shopping season in the city and was a big deal with the American ambassador and other dignitaries present.

My sermon, "*A truly daring people,*" was taken from Matthew 6:25-33 and focused on the courage the Pilgrims had when they strode up the gangplank to *The Mayflower* and set off across the ocean to the New World. I also spoke about the courage people have today, perhaps not in the manner of crossing the ocean in tiny ships, but the courage God's people have to live each day.

This courage that comes from a faith that beckons us to leave the safety and security of our old way of living. This courage provided the strength to a group of people to establish a church at Grinnell and Gillaspie in 1964. This courage has seen people come within the walls of the church to share food, fellowship, music, and so much more.

With all the courage it takes to do the things the church is called to do – "*Loving God. Creating Hope. Changing Lives*" – there remains a timidity present within us. With all the courage we have witnessed over the years, there still is fear at work when we fail to hold each other accountable for our discipleship. With all the courage we have available to us through the presence of the Holy Spirit, we tend to cling to the "good old days" as a safer bet than the daring, God-shaped future that could be ours.

Turning to the courage that is ours for the asking, I offer here a hymn Charles Wesley published on November 29, 1763 (during the Seven Years War), which is sung to the tune, "Oh God Our Help In Ages Past."

Sing to the Lord by whom we live, From whom our blessings spring, Who doth to us salvation give, And vict'ry to our king.

Thee, Conqueror of our foes we greet, Thee, Lord of hosts proclaim, And cast our laurels at thy feet, And tremble at thy name.

With lowly reverential joy Thy mercy we embrace, This solemn interval employ In ceaseless prayer and praise.

Whate'er these threatening wars portend, Whate'er thy will decrees, Our souls that on thy love depend, Are kept in perfect peace.

Our loving confidence is sure, Our Guardian-Rock stands fast, Under its shade we dwell secure, 'Till every storm is past.

Who rest beneath th' Almighty's wings, May cast their cares away: Whate'er event tomorrow brings, We live for God to-day.

Live each day as people who are not afraid – of death or of life. Live, and show the world what true courage looks like, courage that comes from living in the presence of God. —Pastor Charles

November 1 is All Saints Day – A sometimes overlooked holy day in United Methodist congregations, it is not nearly as well known as the day before, All Hallows' (Saints') Eve, better known as Halloween, but All Saints Day is far more important in the life of the church. John Wesley, founder of the Methodist movement, enjoyed and celebrated All Saints Day. In a journal entry from November 1, 1767, Wesley calls it "a festival I truly love." On Sunday, November 6, we will remember the saints in our lives and in the life of St. Paul's UMC.
