As I write this in mid-August, it is mere days before the start of another school year here in Boulder County and at the University of Colorado Boulder. Growing up, every time the calendar showed a new school year was about to start, I was ready! The beginning of each new year brings back many memories of my laying out new clothes for the first day of class, making sure I had my supplies ready to go, and looking forward to getting to know my new teacher(s).

I raise this subject because while only a few of us at St. Paul's are currently engaged in formal educational pursuits as teachers or students, all of us are, by virtue of being Christians, compelled to make learning part of our life. We are to be people who make reading, studying, sharing, and digesting the scriptures a central tenet of our faith. We should be reading about prayer, studying the works of the key figures of the Christian faith, exploring contemporary issues through the lenses of faith, plumbing the depths of the scriptures, and much more.

If we are to continue to exist as a community of faith, understanding our faith and our role within it through our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness is essential. We cannot continue to function as a vital community of faith unless we understand and are able to articulate why our faith is relevant to us and to the world around us.

I invite you to join with me this autumn in growing in your faith. It is worth it, trust me!

Advent/Christmas Devotional

Pastor Charles invites the congregation to participate in the creation of the fourth annual Advent and Christmas devotional. The theme for this year's devotional is sometimes called a crèche, Nativity set, or manger scene. St. Francis of Assisi created the first crèche in 1223, in an attempt to bring the focus of Christmas back to the birth of Christ and away from material, gift-giving customs.

It's simple!

- 1) Select a person, an animal, or an element of the Nativity that speaks to you. You can also describe a Nativity set that you have in your home that is special to you.
- 2) Write a short reflection (one to two brief paragraphs) on what that that person, animal, element, or set means to you.
- 3) Submit your devotion to the office by November 1 either in writing or via email.

You can write about anything in a Nativity set including but not limited to halos, Infant Jesus, Joseph, swaddling clothes, Mary, shepherds, The Magi (traditional names: Balthazar, Melchior, & Gaspar), gifts of the Magi (gold, frankincense, & myrrh), the traditional ethnicities of the Magi (Europe, Asia, & Africa), the Magi's animals (camels, horses, or elephants), the stable animals (lambs, a rooster, a dog, or cattle), a well, palm branches, the manger, a cave, a barn, the stable, and contemporary figures including farmers, bakers, and candlestick makers, etc.
