

From The Pastor's Desk...

It may seem odd to be thinking about Advent and Christmas already, but that is what we are already doing at St. Paul's UMC! I would like to invite the congregation to take part in preparing entries for the fifth annual Advent and Christmas devotional. Advent begins on Sunday, December 3, and you are invited to take part in the season of anticipation and celebration with a devotional that will be shared with the community.

This year's theme is **the names and titles [given or ascribed] for Jesus**. There are many names and titles found in the scriptures. Some of these are well known, such as the Son of God, Messiah, and Emmanuel/Immanuel. Others are less well known, such as Dayspring, Lion of Judah, and Morning Star. When we name or describe the One whom we follow, we are joining Christians across the centuries in sharing what we believe about this Jesus of Nazareth.

There a three easy steps to participate:

- 1. Select any one of the multitude of names or titles that speak to the theme of this special season. A list of some of the many names/titles will be on the usher's table on September 3. You may choose from this list or provide an alternative name/title and the supporting scripture reference for your choice.
- 2. Write a one or two paragraph reflection on what that name or title means to you.
- 3. Submit it to the church office by November 15 via email.

A sign-up list will be available on the usher's table at the back of the sanctuary on September 3. You may also email the office with your choice. Entries are needed for December 3-24. As in years past, I will prepare entries for the Twelve Days of Christmas and the Day of Epiphany (December 25-January 6).

Print copies of the devotional will be available on November 24. We will post daily entries on the blog and on our Facebook page each day of Advent (starting on December 3) and concluding on the Day of Epiphany (January 6).

2023 FOOD DRIVE FOR EFAA

EFAA continues to see an increase in customers at their food pantry. The cost of food, toiletries, and just about every necessity is getting higher every week. This means more need with fewer people to contribute. Julie Van Domelen, executive director at the Emergency Family Assistance Association, says that in the past month, 40% of people who came to EFAA for help with food, housing, etc. were new to EFAA. That number is expected to increase with school starting and the approach of colder weather. According to EFAA data, 4,797 children in Boulder County live in poverty – a startling statistic. Fall Study Opportunity

Do you ever think about crossing your fingers behind your back when you recite parts (or all) of the Apostles' Creed? Does Original Sin mean that those who die and are unable to accept Jesus, like babies, go directly to hell? Isn't being orthodox basically the same as fundamentalism (or Fundamentalism)? Does the doctrine of the Trinity amount to a belief in three gods? Does doctrine really matter, or should we just "follow the example of Jesus"? If you've ever asked questions like these, you may enjoy a new Sunday morning class presented by Tim Cook — "Who's Afraid of Orthodoxy?: Challenges, Misconceptions, and the Promise of Perennial Christian Truth." This study will be offered at 8:45 a.m. in St Paul's library, beginning Sunday, September 10. Reading will be minimal (a few handouts), and much discussion will be encouraged.
